Free and Low-Cost Tax Filing Options

There are multiple free and low-cost options for filing your taxes, to include, but not limited to:

There are Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) sites that will help you file your taxes for free if your household income does not exceed \$59,000 and do not have a return that is considered out-of-scope for VITA. (<https://www.hawaiitaxhelp.org/free-tax-help/free-taxsites/>).

The IRS provides free online filing if your income is \$66,000 or less (<https://www.irs.gov/filing/free-file-do-your-federal-taxes-for-free>).

Military OneSource provides free online tax preparation for military members (<http://www.militaryonesource.mil/-/miltax-free-tax-services-from-military-onesource>).

Liberty Tax offers \$50 off tax preparation for military members (<https://www.libertytax.com/promotions/military-com/>).

TaxSlayer offers military members 50% their online tax filing service (<https://www.taxslayer.com/efile/discount-military-tax-filing>).

TurboTax offers military members E-5 and below free online tax preparation, and E-6 above a \$5 discount for online tax preparation (<https://turbotax.intuit.com/personal-taxes/online/military-edition.jsp>).
