General Court-Martial

- At a General Court-Martial in Norfolk, Virginia, an E-4 was tried for rape and aggravated assault. On 12 March 2020, the panel of members returned a verdict of not guilty.

Special Court-Martial

- At a Special Court-Martial in Mayport, Florida, MM3 Micole A. Daugherty, USN, was tried for conspiracy to commit obstruction of justice, unauthorized absence, and false official statement. On 4 March 2020, the panel of members returned a verdict of guilty of conspiracy to commit obstruction of justice, unauthorized absence, and false official statement and sentenced her to be discharged with a Bad Conduct Discharge, reduction in rank to paygrade E-1, and confinement for 7 months.

Navy Region Northwest

General Court-Martial

- At a General Court-Martial in Bremerton, Washington, AT1 Joshua J. McDonald, USN, pled guilty pursuant to a pretrial agreement to attempted sexual assault of a child. On 10 March 2020, consistent with the pretrial agreement, the military judge sentenced him to be discharged with a Bad Conduct Discharge and reduction in rank to paygrade E-1.

Special Court-Martial

- At a Special Court-Martial in Bremerton, Washington, ETN1 Pedro A. Romancano, USN, pled guilty pursuant to a pretrial agreement to six specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance. On 6 March 2020, consistent with the pretrial agreement, the military judge sentenced him to reduction in rank to paygrade E-3 and confinement for 150 days. The pretrial agreement contained a waiver of the accused's administrative separation board.
- At a Special Court-Martial in Bremerton, Washington, AO3 Alejandro R. Layden, USN, pled guilty pursuant to a pretrial agreement to wrongful distribution of a controlled substance and two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance. On 12 March 2020, the military judge sentenced him to be discharged with a Bad Conduct Discharge and reduction in rank to paygrade E-1. The pretrial agreement had no effect on his sentence.

Navy Region Southwest

Special Court-Martial

- At a Special Court-Martial in San Diego, California, SR Patrick A. Self, USN, pled guilty pursuant to a pretrial agreement to one specification of unauthorized absence, seven specifications of larceny, one specification of attempting to fraudulently use a debit card, two specifications of use of a debit card without authorization, two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and two specifications of unlawful entry. On 4 March 2020, consistent with the pretrial agreement, the military judge sentenced him to be discharged with a Bad Conduct Discharge and confinement for 12 months.
- At a Special Court-Martial in San Diego, California, GSCS Claudie Marcelin, USN, pled guilty pursuant to a pretrial agreement to sexual harassment. On 17 March 2020, consistent with the pretrial agreement, the military judge sentenced him to reduction in

rank to paygrade E-7. The pretrial agreement contained a waiver of the accused's administrative separation board.

Special Court-Martial

- At a Special Court-Martial in Norfolk, Virginia, ENC Michael D. Clark, USN, pled guilty pursuant to a pretrial agreement to wrongful use of a controlled substance and wrongful cohabitation with a prostitute. On 11 March 2020, the military judge sentenced him to reduction in rank to paygrade E-4 and confinement for 4 months. Pursuant to the pretrial agreement, all confinement in excess of 60 days is to be suspended. The suspended punishment may be served if the Service Member violates the terms of the pretrial agreement. The pretrial agreement contained a waiver of the accused's administrative separation board.
